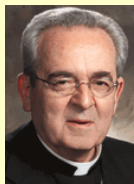
ProLifeSummit

A day after last January's March for Life, President Obama overturned the Mexico City Policy, which had prohibited U.S. funds from being used to promote or provide abortions overseas.

Shortly thereafter, he started moving to overturn conscience protections for healthcare workers, that would force them to cooperate in abortion or risk losing their jobs. Then he dedicated federal funds to harvest embryonic stem cells for research at the expense of the most defenseless members of the human family.

These are but three of many federal and state regulations that are now being altered to accommodate the culture of death in our society. The purpose of this Pro-Life Summit is to sort out a strategic plan for all Christians to sustain opposition to abortion but moreso to build a victorious platform in favor of defending life and renewing family values.
